



Fast and Furious 7 (2015)



Cheese and Onion Pie

Prep Time: 30 minutes | Cook Time: 30 minutes

Servings: 4

Skill Level: Medium

<u>Ingredients</u>

- 1-2 rolls of ready rolled Shortcrust Pastry (depending on the size of your dish)

- 200g potatoes (about 2 medium potatoes)
- 1-2 red onions
- 1 tbsp butter
- 2 tsp olive oil
- 175g cheese
- Black pepper and salt (to taste)

Method

- 1. Peel the potatoes and cut into small pieces. Place them in a saucepan filled with water and allow it to boil. Salt the water and cook the potatoes for approximately 10 minutes or until it can be easily cut with a knife. Strain the potatoes and set aside to cool.
- 2. Thinly slice the onions. Add the butter and the 2 tsp oil into the frying pan and set over a medium heat. Add the sliced onions to pan and allow it to cook until they are translucent and soft (it should take approximately 15 minutes). Once cooked, put them on greaseproof paper or kitchen roll to absorb excess oil.
- 3. Preheat the oven to 180°C
- 4. Combine the potatoes with the onions and season to taste with salt and pepper
- 5. Roll out the ready rolled shortcrust pastry. Depending on the size of your dish, use 1 roll and cut in half if it is small or two for a larger dish (one piece for the bottom and one for the top)
- 6. Lightly grease the dish and place one piece of the pastry at the bottom
- 7. Add in the filling mixture and cheese and spread evenly.
- 8. Place the second pastry sheet on top and gently press the edges together to seal and trim off any excess pastry. Brush the top with a little milk or a whisked egg and cut a small slit in the middle to allow steam to escape.
- 9. Bake in the oven for 30-35 minutes or until the pastry is cooked through with a golden colour on top. Remove from the oven once cook and allow to cool for 5 minutes before cutting and serving.

TIP: you can try other fillings, such as: chicken or even baked beans!



Chocolate Nests

Prep Time: 25 minutes | Cook Time: 8 minutes

Servings: 12

Skill Level: Easy

Ingredients

- 200g Milk Chocolate
- 85g Crushed Shredded Wheat
- Mini Chocolate Eggs



Method

- 1. Melt the chocolate in a bowl over a pan of hot water.
- 2. Take off the heat, once melted, and stir in the shreddies until combined.
- 3. Spoon the mixture in to 12 cupcake cases and press the back of a teaspoon in the centre to create a nest shape.
- 4. Add 1-3 mini eggs on top of each nest and allow to set in the fridge for 2 hours.





You will need:

A Mason Jar

Floral decorative (washi) tape, stickers, markers, glitter, paint
 Spring Flowers of your Choice

- 1. Make sure your jar is clean and is ready to work with
- 2. Decorate your jar however you wish. Marker pens, floral tape and stickers are just some examples!
- 3. Once you are happy with how it looks, add your flavours and water into the jar!


